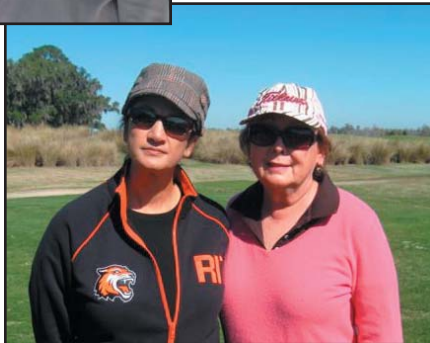
## MEMBER/MEMBER GOLF TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS

With the majority of the field scoring in the 60s, it became a race for second place. The final day started with pristine weather, enabling the field to take advantage of the conditions and to try to catch the leaders. Mr. Rogers and Mr. Killian did not give an

## HOOK AND SLICE

## SPANISH MACKEREL TOURNAMENT JULY 2

Although relatively small in size, Spanish Mackerel are formidable game fish on light tackle. They inhabit the in-shore and near-shore waters of coastal Georgia during the summer months. They can be caught on a wide variety of bait, including spoons and flies. *This is a great tournament for the entire family.* The entry fee includes a boxed lunch, bait, snacks, and prizes. Awards will be presented in the evening at the Independence Day Celebration at Lake Dye Grill at 6:00 p.m.

## “SILVA DOLLA” TARPON TOURNAMENT AUGUST 12-13

The “Silva Dolla” is the only tarpon tournament in Georgia and the longest running tarpon tournament in South Carolina and Georgia. We are fortunate to have these spectacular game fish migrate into our waters during the summer months. The general size of Georgia tarpon ranges from 50–150 pounds, and they are spectacular quarry on any type of tackle. The entry fee includes two days of fishing, beverages and box lunches, tournament shirt, Captains’ meeting cookout, awards dinner, continental breakfast at Ogeechee Outfitters Friday and Saturday mornings, and all tackle and bait for chartered boats.

## JIMMY HOUSTON, “AMERICA’S FAVORITE FISHERMAN,” FILMS TWO SHOWS AT THE FORD PLANTATION

Jimmy Houston, “America’s Favorite Fisherman,” visited The Ford Plantation Friday, March 18 and filmed two fishing shows that will air nationally on the Versus network during the winter of 2012. Jimmy has been fishing bass professionally for more than thirty years and has won numerous bass tournaments and was once named Bass Anglers Sportsman Society’s Angler of the Year. His popular fishing and hunting show, *Jimmy Houston Outdoors*, has been a staple for the avid outdoorsman for many years.

“This really highlights the great fishing opportunities that are available to members right on Ford property,” said Fuzzy Davis, Ford’s Outdoor Pursuit Director. “During the filming, many bass, crappie, flounder, and catfish were landed. It was really neat to highlight the unique diversity in Lake Clara where fresh and saltwater fish were caught simultaneously. This is probably one of the only lakes on the east coast where this is happening. We really have a very special habitat in Lake Clara and it’s really great that others will be able to see that on national television.”

Fuzzy and Jimmy fished the first show on Lake Sterling. The second show was filmed on Lake Clara and at the Ford Marina with Jimmy’s guest Chris Finnegan, Operations Manager at Bass Pro Shop in Savannah. The steps at the Marina turned out to be a real honey hole with many Ogeechee bass—up to seven pounds—caught and released. We will keep you updated on the exact airing time of the shows.

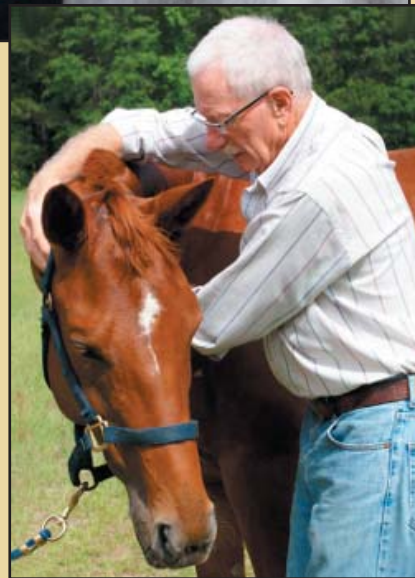
## SPA DAY AND CHIROPRACTIC / ACUPUNCTURE TREATMENTS AT THE EQUESTRIAN CENTER
