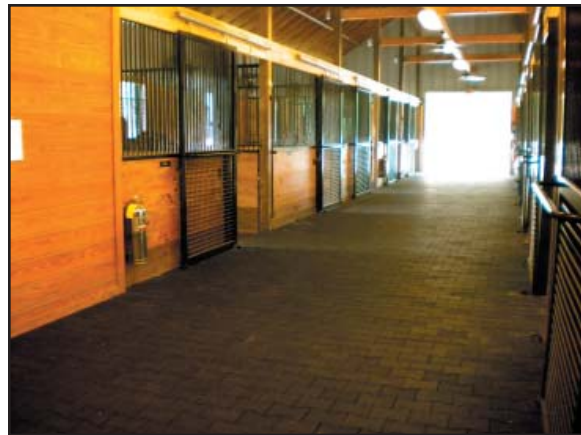
TFP FEATURED IN SOUTHERN WEDDINGS MAGAZINE

ARB UPDATE—BUILDING ACTIVITY AT FORD

Summer and fall were busy seasons for home building at The Ford Plantation. The Architectural Review Board, which provides architectural and landscaping design oversight for the Plantation, provides the following update. - Three homes that were started in 2010 were completed. The completed homes were Gonzales-Lot 65, Rockwood-Lot 66, and O'Bannon-Lot 251. A small addition was also completed for the Bartletts-Lot 82.
- Additions have been approved for Kopac-Lot 68, Hamilton-Lot 213, and Coleman-Lot CH34. The Hamilton addition is now under construction. Work on the other two projects is expected to begin in the next few months.

- Construction also recently began on two new homes: Wickes-Lot 97 and Davies-Lot 190. These homes are in the "framing/drying-in" stages. A garage addition is underway for the Sawyer property at Lot CH42.

- Plans for a new home and dependent structures on the Fielding property-Lot M8 are expected to be presented for the ARB's review at the December meeting.

OUTDOOR PURSUITS—NATURE, FISHING, & SHOOTING

HUNT FOR BIG RED RESULTS

Perfect weather, light winds, hungry fish, and eager anglers all added up to a great fishing tournament on October 15. The Hunt for Big Red had 35 participants fishing on 10 boats, which is a new record for this event. The large adult red drum are fall spawners and school up in our sound and in the near shore sand bars during October and November. They are great sport on light tackle and thrill anglers up and down the Georgia coast. The ocean running red drum (also known as bull reds) can weigh up to 50 pounds but most fish are between 25 and 40 pounds.

This year, 25 fish were caught during the Tournament. A big congratulations to Capt Mike Womble and his crew, Bob Bernstein and Myles, Myles Jr., and Jack Gillespie for their first place win with a total of six redfish. Jack also caught the longest fish—49 inches.

GATOR SPOTTING 2011

What a wonderful Gator Spotting season for 2011. We were able to tag over 10 new small alligators, each of which was numbered and then named by the participants in the field. The tagged alligators will be monitored for growth and movements around Lake Clara.

Gator Spotting begins by choosing a canoe and a partner and setting out on the lake to look for all sorts of wildlife. This year we saw several species of bats, which were greedily eating many different insect species, frogs, fish, shrimp, raccoons, deer, and even a Great Horned Owl. It is always exciting to get out on the lake at night and explore the magnificent wildlife that Ford has to offer.

The ultimate goal is to, of course, locate a few alligators. We then will try to capture a small alligator to measure and tag. Each tag is numbered and will stay with the alligator indefinitely. All the records go into a database located at The Oyster House. Each time we recapture an alligator, we can tell where it has traveled, how much it has grown, and the overall health of the animal. It truly is one of the great adventures that we have here at The Ford Plantation.

We hope to see y'all out there next year for another exciting Gator Spotting season!

EQUINE CONNECTION

The Ford Plantation Equestrian Center is proud to offer “Equine Connection,” an innovative personal discovery program where participants explore their communication, relationship, and leadership styles through interactions with a horse. Created and developed by Equestrian Center Manager Sheryl Jordan more than 15 years ago, this program is available to everyone and does not require any previous horse-handling or riding experience.

This unique program offers individuals an opportunity to connect and interact with horses by learning how these animals communicate with us and interact with each other as a herd. Participants will recognize powerful parallels between the horse and human relationships.



Through groundwork and round-pen exercises, participants will learn how to relate to horses on many levels. Through this interaction, they will develop a deeper awareness of their communication, relationship, and leadership styles and skills.

By successfully achieving goals working with the horse in the round-pen, participants will be given effective communication and leadership tools to carry into other aspects of their lives. Bring an open mind and open heart to the program to maximize this opportunity.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Through the Equine Connection program, participants will develop the following skills: listen on a higher level, trust your intuition, use personal strength with humility, withhold judgment until a relationship has been developed, practice open-mindedness, be fully engaged in the moment, be aware of the power in your presence, recognize communication effectiveness and incongruence, balance pride with humility, direct and lead by trust versus intimidation, and fully realize the responsibility that comes with leadership. Through interactions with the horse, you will find a higher level of authenticity and empowerment.



CONTACT AND PRICING INFO

Equestrian Center Manager Sheryl Jordan has facilitated this program for corporate management teams, men’s and women’s groups, inner-city students, families, and at-risk individuals. They have all learned the value of leadership, authenticity, communication, and healthy relationship-building skills with the horse as a key teaching partner. The fee for the Equine Connection program is \$50/hour for a private session and \$25/hour/person for a group session. The program is designed in 4-hour (minimum) and 8-hour (full day) sessions; however, it can be customized to your individual or group needs.
